

2022 WOMEN'S SENIOR INDIVIDUAL PENNANT REGULATIONS

1. The Competition:

1.1 The competition will one division of a maximum of eight teams.

1.2 Each team will consist of five players.

1.3 Clubs may only nominate one team.

2. Eligibility:

A minimum of three players must have attained the age of fifty-five years as at the date of the fixture. The remaining team positions are open to any player who has attained the age of fifty years as at the date of the fixture.

3. Matches:

3.1 Format

The format will be "off the stick" match play.

3.2 The competition will be played on either a Monday or Tuesday at the discretion of the host club. All matches are to be played predominately in the afternoon.

3.3 Clubs will play against each club in their division only once during the season.

3.4 Players will be listed in Daily Handicap order (ie. Lowest handicap player at number one and so on). Should two players have the same Daily Handicap they may be listed in an order of the teams choosing (i.e. the player with the lowest GA handicap does not have to be listed first).

2.8. The team in the division with the most contest points at the end of all rounds will win the pennant. In the event of a tie in the team points at the conclusion of the competition, the count back procedure outlined in the consolidated regulations (point 6) will apply.

3.3 Play will be over 18 holes and any match finishing 'all square' after 18 holes will be deemed a half.

4. Caddies:

Are permitted.

5. Interchange of Players:

Players can only compete in one match per round (ie. Either the Individual competition or 4 ball Competition).

6. Motorised golf carts:

There is no specific condition for this competition which prohibits the use of a motorised cart for any player, however those players that require the use of a cart for medical reasons may pre-book one with the host club prior to the fixture. Should additional motorised carts be available for hire on the day of the fixture any player(s) may avail themselves of the use of a motorised golf cart at their expense.

If the use of a motorised cart is compulsory at a host venue then the cost must be borne by the host club.
