

# 2022-23 WA Senior Women's Ranking System

To be eligible to receive a WA Senior Women's ranking players must be female amateur golfers, **50 years of age and over**, that reside in Western Australia and hold a normal Golf Australia (GA) Handicap as defined in the GA Handicap System. Events included in the ranking system must be played off the stick and are categorised into two levels. Players will receive ranking points for gross finishing positions in the following events;

Points to be awarded as follows

Category 1 Top 20 WA players in gross finishing order will receive ranking points by way of;

- 1<sup>st</sup> Place = 100 points
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Place = 95 points



• 3<sup>rd</sup> Place = 90 points

And so forth until 20<sup>th</sup> position = 5 points

Every other participant below 20<sup>th</sup> position receives = 0 Points to show they have played in the event.

## Category 2 Top 16 WA players in gross finishing order will receive ranking points by way of;

- 1<sup>st</sup> Place = 80 points
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Place = 75 points
- 3<sup>rd</sup> Place = 70 points

And so forth until 16<sup>th</sup> position = 5 points

Every other participant below 16<sup>th</sup> position receives = 0 Points to show they have played in the event.

## Category 3 Top 12 WA players in gross finishing order will receive ranking points by way of;

- 1<sup>st</sup> Place = 60 points
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Place = 55 points
- 3<sup>rd</sup> Place = 50 points

And so forth until 12<sup>th</sup> position = 5 points

Every other participant below 12<sup>th</sup> position receives = 0 Points to show they have played in the event.

At the conclusion of the rankings season the player with the highest number of ranking points along with the leading WA player from the Bowra & O'Dea Senior Open in August will be invited to form a representative WA team to compete in the Australian Seniors Championship in October. Should this leading player also be the leading WA player in the Bowra & O'Dea Senior Open the next highest ranked player will receive the invitation to be a representative on the WA team. Similarly, if a player declines the invitation the next highest ranked player will receive the invitation.

#### **Total Ranking Points Received**

The total number of ranking points a player will receive will be determined using the table below.

### Note that a player must play a minimum of five events to qualify for the rankings.
