Introduction and Purpose

The safety of players, caddies, volunteers, officials and followers at GolfWA managed events is of paramount importance. This document aims to provide an overview of GolfWA's policy on the treatment of severe weather conditions, either anticipated or during any event managed by GolfWA.

Scope

This procedure applies to any GolfWA managed events where there is a possible or actual risk of lightning occurring and when players, staff and spectators may be exposed to extremes of temperature as per below.

Policy

GolfWA defines "severe weather" as anticipated or observed climatic conditions such as:

- high (>30C) to very high (>35C) to extremely high (>40C) temperatures and humidity
- lightning, hail, heavy rain, fog, high winds (>40kph)
- low temperatures (<5C) to very low temperatures (<0C)

that require consideration or demand, the amendment, suspension, postponement, resumption or cancellation of play.

GolfWA reserves the right to amend, postpone or cancel a GolfWA event if <u>anticipated</u> weather conditions are deemed unsafe for play within 48 hours of the event commencing.

During a GolfWA managed event, a GolfWA Official will be rostered to monitor local weather conditions and will be authorised to amend, postpone, suspend, resume or cancel play according to the GolfWA's "Severe Weather Monitoring and Action Procedures" and direct players, caddies, volunteers, officials and followers accordingly. Considerations that will be taken in account will include 'feels like' temperature according to available data and age of competitors.

The following procedures reference GolfAustralia's "Hot Weather Guidelines", the "Flash to Bang" method for determining levels of lightning hazard, and GolfWA's experience of Western Australian weather conditions in conjunction with recommendations from Golf Australia's "Elite Competition Administration Manual".

Procedures

The following tables detail what actions should be taken in preparation, or when certain weather conditions are forecast prior to an event, or observed during an event. The Golf Australia "Elite Competition Administration Manual, Section 8: Suspension of Play and Evacuation Plan" should act as a reference for all GolfWA events.



Prior to a GolfWA Event:

The GolfWA Event Manager should monitor or delegate the monitoring of weather conditions, prior to the event. Decisions such as amendments, postponements or cancellations should be taken after consultation with hosts and/or competition officials.

During a GolfWA Event:

The GolfWA Event Manager should monitor or delegate the monitoring of weather conditions, throughout the duration of the event day. Decisions should be taken after consultation with competition officials.

Hot	Temperature < 40C	Resume	Resume play when temperature falls below 40C, if decision to suspend has been actioned.		Siren - 2 short blasts
Cold	Temperature < 0C	Suspend Dangerous	Hyperthermia risk, suspend play and direct competitors, officials, volunteers and spectators to designated assembly point points via marshals and evacuate everyone to safety.		Siren - 1 long blast
Cold	Temperature < 5C	Advise	Monitor, advise competitors, marshals, officials, volunteers and spectators to stay warm via clothing.	GolfWA Event Manager	Tournament Noticeboard
